

1. How do I sign up for rooms for Fellowship gatherings?
  - In phase 3, one can sign up for rooms that they will want to use via the Room reservation form. The reservation will have to be sent in a minimum of a week in advance prior to the actual date of using the rooms. Reoccurring room reservation is not allowed during phase 3. If you want to reserve multiple dates then multiple requests must be sent in.

  - In phase 4, the Congregation Ministry Committee (CMC) will look at the room assignments prior to the pandemic and reevaluate the needs of the fellowships for phase 4 and phase 5. Reoccurring fellowships time will be allowed in phase 4/5 as the reopening committee will be reassigning the rooms. Do note that the preferred day and time may or may not be given depending on the fellowship's demographic.
  - In phase 4, if room reservation is needed outside of fellowship, then please use the former CCCC room reservation system on the church website.
2. Will there be church resources for doing hybrid model?
  - Some church resources can be used for doing the hybrid model if a fellowship chooses to go with model. The church will provide the space and TV as needed to accommodate. The fellowship will be responsible for the computer and webcam to stream with the individual online. Do note that WiFi at the church may be limited. With ample testing from Ministry Technology (MT), CCCC can only support up to 3 simultaneous streams at a time. If the church is used by multiple fellowships, there may not be enough bandwidth for all to stream from the WiFi.
3. What are the guidelines for phase 3/4?
  - If one is sick or is caring/living with another individual who is sick, please stay at home
  - It is highly encouraged to use a face covering at all times within the church building.
  - Exception to the face covering is allowed if:
    - i. Those involved with speaking or singing in front of camera during service.
    - ii. Those consuming food/drinks at church
    - iii. Children younger than 5 years of age.
    - iv. Individuals who have trouble breathing normally with the face covering.
    - v. Individuals who have trouble breathing normally for a long time with the face covering.
    - vi. Individuals who are unconscious or incapacitated.
  - Try to maintain social distancing when possible.
  - Water bottles should be brought from home to drink water from. Water fountains is only to be used to refill water bottles.
  - After a room is used, all tables and chairs should be wiped down with provided sanitizing wipes located in the room.
  - All tables and chairs should be put away prior to leaving
4. I've been vaccinated, do I have to wear a facial covering?
  - Yes, CCCC still highly encourages people to wear a face covering within the church building during phase 3 and phase 4. This to allow individuals to feel comfortable and safe to return in person per the survey results. Also though the CDC does state for vaccinated individuals it is safe to do things indoors, CCCC is still encouraging facial

covering as it is a proven way to highly reduce the likelihood of transmission of COVID19 and its variants.

5. Can we eat at church?

- Though it isn't recommended, one may eat at church.
- If one does decide to eat within church in a group, it is best to take steps to lessen the amount of risk of transmission of COVID19 as much as possible. i.e., Individual containers for each individual's food, tables spaced out for social distancing, and etc.
- Potluck is the riskiest option for food. If one does decide to go down this route then some suggestions are having some individuals serve to lessen the amount of touching the same items, having hand sanitizers at the start of the table, facial covering being worn near the shared food.

6. Do I have to put away chairs and tables before I leave church?

- Yes, in phase 3 and phase 4 we are asking the fellowships/gatherings to put away chairs and tables after they have used the items. This is to allow fellowships that use the rooms at a later time/date to know that the tables and chairs have been put away were disinfected and can be used without worry.
- Prior to putting away chairs and tables, we also ask the fellowships/gatherings to also disinfect the tables and chairs with the disinfectant wipes provided in the rooms.

7. Does the church provide disinfectant wipes?

- Yes, the church will provide disinfectant wipes for fellowship/gatherings to wipe down the tables and chairs prior to putting them away.
- Each room will be stocked with a hand sanitizer and disinfectant wipes, if the room were to run out then let the GM Deacon know so that he can restock the rooms.
